Following the Birdslanding event, the California State Building Trades Council held their 13th Annual Roger Hamilton Golf Invitational, raising approximately \$95,000! As always 100% of the proceeds donated to the Mesothelioma Research Foundation of America, go directly towards research. Over the past 13 years the Roger Hamilton Golf Invitational

has generated well over \$1.2 million dollars through the tireless efforts of Roger Hamilton, Event Chairwoman, Cindy Hamilton, Retired California State Building Trades President, Bob Balgenorth and current California State Building Trades President, Robbie Hunter. I would like to take this time to thank them, as well as everyone who has a hand in making this event a monumental success every year, including every one of you who came out and participated! **THANK YOU!**

In July, the Southern California Pipetrades District Council 16 held their Annual Golf Invitational benefitting mesothelioma research and witnessed an unbelievable turnout and effort. Together, District Council 16 and their supporters generated over \$90,000! To date their event has raised nearly \$1.2 million dollars for mesothelioma research and one of our staple events. As you will read, we began hearing of the AMAZING success and promise the new cancer fighting drug, EphB-4 is showing in clinical trials. Dr. Parkash Gill passed along the news of the continued treatment of a mesothelioma patient he had spoken about at last year's events, noting she has been mesothelioma free after 18 months of treatment! As the success is being repeated in other patient's stories, the Mesothelioma Labs at USC/Norris and San Diego, California have increased the production of the protein needed to make additional batches of EphB-4 by purchasing new equipment with the donation money received. We are so proud of the fact that the developments made in the laboratory are turning into viable treatment options for patients, who are given little hope once diagnosed! I can tell you with absolute confidence that we would not be where we are at today without the support of our partners at the California State Pipe Trades Council, the California State Building & Construction Trades and the Southern California Pipetrades District Council 16.

Lastly I would like to thank you, the reader, for your individual support. As many of you know the event was established through the brainstorming of California Building Trades Vice President and International Representative of the Insulators Roger Hamilton, U.A. International Representative of the Pipetrades in California and Hawaii Jim Kellogg and the California Building Trades President Bob Balgenorth. Roger felt the need to support research into a cure for mesothelioma while promoting less tobacco use in the building trades. 

Report from the Lab: Eph-B4 as a Therapy for Mesothelioma



Malignant pleural mesothelioma often develops decades following exposure to asbestos. Currently, the best therapy produces a response in only half of the patients, and the median survival with the current therapy remains under a year. A search for novel targets and therapeutics is underway, and recently identified therapeutics includes Eph-B4.

The mesothelioma research lab at USC/Norris Comprehensive Cancer Center, where our donations go, has investigated the use of Eph-B4 in human mesothelioma tissues by immunohistochemistry. Xenograft tumors established with human mesothelioma cells were treated with an Eph-B4 inhibitor, as well as with a combination effect of Eph-B4 and a biologic agent. Eph-B4 was overexpressed, or shrunk the size of the tumor, in 72% of the mesothelioma tissues evaluated, with 85% of epithelioid and 38% of sarcomatoid subtypes demonstrating overexpression. The Eph-B4 inhibitor was highly active as a single agent to inhibit tumor growth and the

combination of Eph-B4 and a biologic agent, Bevacizumab, was superior to each agent alone and led to complete tumor regression!

Since the study, Eph-B4 has been submitted to the FDA for Phase I Clinical Trials and is currently being offered to patients at the USC/Norris Comprehensive Cancer Center. Doctors from facilities such as, the University of Chicago, University of California, Davis, University of California, San Diego and Georgetown University, want to work with USC/Norris in treating more patients by offering their patients Eph-B4.



The Mesothelioma Research Foundation of America has a mission: fund research that will lead to the quickest cure for mesothelioma. Mesothelioma, a cancer of the lining of the lungs caused by asbestos exposure, has very few treatment options at this time. Since the year 2001, the Foundation has funded the opening of the Mesothelioma Laboratory under the supervision of Dr. Parkash Gill at the USC/Norris Comprehensive Cancer Center in Los Angeles. Since the lab's inception Dr. Gill has received FDA approval from the U.S. Government to conduct Clinical Trials using new mesothelioma treatments he has developed in the laboratory, whose research is 100% funded by the Foundation. A recent example of the research being done by Dr. Gill, and the direct results of the donations received, is the submission and approval from the FDA to use EPH-B4 in Phase I Clinical Trials. We are all very excited at the possibilities of a more effective treatment for patients suffering from mesothelioma!
